- + Promotion and advice on sustainable land-use practices
- + Specialist technical advice, information and on-farm visits
- + Technical material and publications, i.e. project reports and technical material etc
- + Sourcing State and Federal funding for specific industry projects
- + Seminars and workshops on industry topics, i.e. hay production, irrigation, soil conservation
- + Conduit and network between other key industry organisations, NT Cattleman and NT Horticultural Associations, funding bodies and Government departments.
